We are continuing to assess the situation in Texas in the aftermath of Hurricane Harvey and ensure that our employees and their families are safe. We ask that all Houston area employees report their status through the [Chevron Employee Emergency Line](#). Our thoughts remain with employees, their families, first responders, and all others affected by this catastrophic storm.

Our top priority is employee safety. This means keeping our workforce out of harm's way and assisting those who may need additional support in times of emergency. A number of employees have already reported storm damage to homes and property. We have implemented our policy to provide financial support to those who may need additional company assistance after exhausting other remedies.

Currently, our Houston offices are operational, but closed Monday and Tuesday to nonessential personnel as a safety precaution. The Houston Regional Crisis Management Team will continue to monitor the impact of Hurricane Harvey and communicate resumption of normal operations to the Houston workforce.

To help with initial relief efforts throughout Houston and south Texas, Chevron is making a [\\$1 million contribution](#) to the American Red Cross.
